<sup>41</sup> Elijah said to Ahab, "Go up, eat and drink; for there is a sound of rushing rain." <sup>42</sup> So Ahab went up to eat and to drink. Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; there he bowed himself down upon the earth and put his face between his knees. <sup>43</sup> He said to his servant, "Go up now, look toward the sea." He went up and looked, and said, "There is nothing." Then he said, "Go again seven times." <sup>44</sup> At the seventh time he said, "Look, a little cloud no bigger than a person's hand is rising out of the sea." Then he said, "Go say to Ahab, 'Harness your chariot and go down before the rain stops you.'" <sup>45</sup> In a little while the heavens grew black with clouds and wind; there was a heavy rain.
